

If a student violates the rules laid forth in this handbook, or exhibits a behavior/attitude that the directors or administration feel is not in the best interest of the band, he/she may be subject to disciplinary action and/or dismissal from the band program. By enrolling in the Corner Band, students agree to abide by these expectations.

Costs & Fees – Winds & Percussion

\$100 Jefferson County Course Fees (*\$50 per semester, due at class registration*)

\$300 for Band Fees. This is paid to the CHS Band Boosters, not the school. Cash, check or card. Due by July 29th. Here is the breakdown of what that covers:

\$125 goes to Marching Band expenses (instruction, music, etc.)

\$100 goes to uniform cleaning & maintenance

\$75 pays for the “Spirit Pack”

- Includes two shirts, sweatshirt, shorts, gloves or stick tape, and socks.
- Additional t-shirts (\$15) can be purchased through prepaid pre-order.

PLUS *\$30 Band Shoes (*required for new marchers, as needed for returners*)

* *Special trip costs are **not** included in the above breakdown.*

* *Receipts are provided at your request. See Band Booster Treasurer.*

* ***DO NOT LET MONEY BE THE REASON YOUR CHILD IS NOT IN BAND.***

We can arrange a payment plan. Please contact Mr. Murphy.

YOU are responsible for acquiring the following items by the start of band camp:

- Tennis shoes
- Large water bottle
- Deodorant – *please use it!*
- Drum sticks (*snare and tenor drummers only*)
- Reeds, cork grease, swabs (*woodwinds only*)
- Valve oil/slide grease & polishing cloths (*brass only*)

Costs & Fees – Guard & Dance

For the 2021 season, we have decided to retain the uniform from the previous year since we used them so little in the year of COVID. This uniform has interchangeable parts with interchangeable parts for customizable looks. We may look at the option of adding components to the uniform to fit the show theme, but this will be at no additional cost to you.

In general, costs have been lowered for returning members and mostly maintained for new members. Refer to the Auxiliary Constitution for full details. Auxiliary members are not subject to any of the payments for winds & percussion page; however, they do have the option to purchase a band shirt for \$15.

The amounts seen below are the **total** amount to be paid.

Member Expectations

As a member of the Corner Band, you are held to a high standard of conduct. Our band has long promoted three values which should guide your actions:

Student Leadership – Done by tryout process

Drum Major – The public face of the marching band, but also dedicated behind the scenes, the Drum Major should be the epitome of a servant leader.

Band Leadership – Leaders will be relied upon for leadership within the ranks. We have the expectation that they will be servant leaders for their peers.

Auxiliary Captains – Will serve by communicating with their section, breakout routine assistance, “keeping the peace,” etc..

Bandroom Rules

- Take PRIDE in the bandroom...keep it clean! (*No trash on floors, put folders up, instruments in cases when not in use, leave cases in lockers, etc.*)
- YOU are responsible for your instrument. Exercise caution and care!
- Your locker should be clean and orderly (*no loose papers, trash, etc.*)
- Leave chairs and stands in their setup.
- No food, drink, or gum (*except bottled water*).
- Appropriate attire should be worn at all band functions.
- Parents, visitors, and other guests must check in through the main office.
- The director’s office is private. Please knock before you enter.

Attendance

Corner Band members are required to attend all rehearsals and performances. If you *must* miss, however, here is what you should know:

REASON	EXCUSED?	ACTION REQUIRED
Family Emergency	Yes	Parent/guardian email or call director as early as possible.
Serious Illness	Yes	Parent/guardian email or call director as early as possible.
Doctor Appointment	Yes	Parent/guardian email or call director in advance; student provides doctor's note.
Approved School Event	Yes	Provide excuse from teacher/sponsor in advance.
Vacation, Camps, Work, etc.	No*	Please schedule around band calendar and contact Mr. Murphy.

**It is the student's responsibility to ensure that their absence is excused. Above all, I ask that you are proactive and communicate with me in advance.*

Unexcused Rehearsal Absence = meet with director, possible suspension

Unexcused Performance Absence = suspension, grade lowered, possible dismissal from band program

Tardy Policy – Students are considered ABSENT if they are 10+ minutes late to a rehearsal with no excuse. Students who *must* arrive late or leave early *must* have a parent/guardian call in advance. Multiple tardies may result in suspension.

** The directors reserve the right to make exceptions on a case-by-case basis.*

“To be on time is to be late; to be early is to be on time.”

Rehearsal

In-School Rehearsals are Monday through Friday from 1:45 – 3:00.

**Be in your seat, ready to play, by 1:48.*

After-School Rehearsals are Monday, Tuesday, & Thursday from 3:00 – 5:00.

**We may shorten or cut these rehearsals as football season winds down.*

“The key to a productive rehearsal is the ability to focus.”

Cell phone use in rehearsal is prohibited, unless otherwise noted by the director.

Students should dress appropriately for outdoor rehearsals.

Tennis shoes are required for safety purposes.

*Sun protection is **strongly** encouraged.*

Performance

Bands exist to perform. They should be taken seriously, but they should also be fun and exciting! The following guidelines should help our performance go smoothly.

- Be prepared – have instrument, equipment, music, uniform, etc.
- Focus your mind during pre-performance warm-ups. It’s not social time.
- No food or drink (except when provided) at performances.
- Stand/sit in your assigned seat during the game/performance.
- After halftime, band members will report back to the stands with 4 minutes left in the 3rd quarter. **No** leaving the stadium; **no** food in uniform.
- Students will be dismissed from games/performances from the band room. Do not leave before this dismissal.

Uniforms

The Band Uniform is a symbol of class, pride & discipline.
Treat it as such when wearing it and not wearing it!

Corner Band members (winds and percussion) will be issued a uniform during band camp by the Band Booster Uniform Manager. Auxiliary members who play in concert band will be issued a band uniform after marching season.

Corner Band uniforms will be turned in at the end of every game in the band room. Please respect the process and those who will be collecting them.

In order for us to look truly “uniform” while in uniform, the following applies:

- **No** hats are to be worn while in uniform other than your shako.
- **No** jewelry is to be worn while in uniform. (Schedule your piercings wisely.)
- **No** food or drink in uniform, except when provided to you.
- The shako should sit low on your forehead when worn. Use your index & middle fingers (appx. 2”) to check between the brim and your nose.
- Only prescription glasses for vision should be worn in uniform.
- Gloves should be worn when holding your instrument. Flutes and clarinets are allowed to carefully cut holes in the gloves at the fingertips.
- Shoes should be tied in a double knot for safety purposes.
- All components of the uniform should fit and be worn as intended.
- Tell the Uniform Manager if your uniform needs adjusting or repair.

Students are responsible for the cost of repairs or replacement of damaged or lost uniform components. If you have an issue, please see a director or the Uniform Manager.

Travel

A completed and signed JEFCEOED PARENTAL PERMISSION FOR STUDENT TRAVEL form must be on file from each student at the beginning of the fall semester before making any trip with the band.

All band members must travel to band functions with the band.

Permission to travel home with parents or other designees must be cleared with the band director *before leaving for the destination.*
(If there is an emergency, please see Mr. Murphy immediately.)

Travel Rules – *Remember, these are for your safety.*

- All Jefferson County student travel regulations apply during travel.
- BE ON TIME! (A.K.A....EARLY!)
- Stay on the bus to which you are assigned.
- Anytime we get off the bus, you are to be in uniform or “Spirit Pack” attire.
 - *Directors will designate which is appropriate ahead of time.*
- Don’t leave the group for any reason without a director or chaperone.
- Make sure your personal property is labeled visibly and clearly.
- Only band members, band staff, and chaperones travel on buses.
- Clean up after yourselves. We will leave things cleaner than we found them. This applies to any buses we ride and any place that we go.
- Chaperones are approved by the director. Please respect their authority.
- Use common sense. If you have to ask yourself “Should I?” then don’t do it.
- Obey health safety rules when applicable.

Fundraising

It takes a lot of money to operate a band program. In order to provide you with the best educational and musical opportunities, as well as keep your participation costs down, the band holds several fundraisers per year.

We need YOU to help fundraise! Take an active role and encourage others to do the same!

Some of the annual fundraisers that we may do include:

- Parking at home football games
- Annual calendar fundraiser
- Sales - Boston Butt / Hams / Chocolate bars / Detergent
- Sponsorships – corporate and local business
- Swamp John’s pick-up dinners
- Dessert bar on concert days
- Donation-based events (like Jazz & BBQ)

Statement on Health Safety

Students are expected to practice common-sense health safety procedures and abide by state and county safety guidelines at all band activities. This could include daily temperature checks, frequent sanitization, and social distancing.

Quitting & Returning Policy

Students that have been a member of the Marching Band or Concert Band and quit are eligible for re-admittance into the band program with permission from the Director of Bands. This is not taken lightly. If this applies to you, please schedule an appointment with Mr. Murphy.

The Corner High School Band will follow the guidelines as set forth in the JEFFERSON COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION NO PASS/NO PLAY REGULATIONS. If you have any questions, please see Mr. Murphy.
